Discussion Questions

1. Which character did you find most compelling? Whose story did you relate to the most? Discuss.
2. If you were offered a chance to board the ship on its two-year mission, would you? Why or why not? If you could name your price, what would it be?
3. “You ever see a movie where people went to space and things went well?” Ryan’s friend Simon jokes. He has a point—but is it *all* bad? If you were to board any spacecraft from any book, film, or TV show, which would you choose and why?
4. In what ways does *Detour* follow certain genre tropes? In what ways does it, well, detour from those?
5. How do the characters deal with internal and external pressures to go to space, or to stay home?
6. To the outside world, Mike Seaver is a hero. Privately, he drinks to quiet his nerves—and his demons. How does this tension play out in the novel? Who else is struggling to reconcile their inner and outer lives?
7. As you read, were you suspicious about the true purpose of the mission? At what point did your doubts emerge? Where would you have made a different choice than one (or all) of the characters?
8. When the characters arrive in the mirror universe, it appears that their lives split at a particular inflection point—a time when they made a decision with major consequences, or took a different path. What do you think your life’s inflection point would be? What would your mirror-universe life look like following that choice?
9. Which scene or passage from the novel stands out to you the most?
10. What questions do you hope will be answered in *Detour*’s sequel?
